

Elmscot is Ofsted Outstanding!





Our Elmscot Day Nursery and Nursery School is 'outstanding in all areas' according to Ofsted Inspectors. In an unannounced, routine inspection, the team received praise for the "very highly quality" of its teaching from the government's inspectors.

The report stated: "The quality of teaching is consistently of a very high quality. Educational programmes are challenging, inspirational and focused to meet the individual needs and interests of all children. As a result, children are provided with rich, varied and imaginative learning experiences. Children make exceptional progress in their learning and development in this vibrant and welcoming nursery."

Manager of Elmscot and one of its Early Years Teachers, Justyna Ogrodniczek said: "I believe that the quality of care and education in the early years is paramount for setting sound foundations for future learning for all children. As a setting we strive to provide the best possible learning experiences and care where each individual child's learning potential is met to a high standard."

The inspector took the opportunity to speak to some parents on the day and in the report stated: "Partnerships with parents, schools and other agencies are excellent. As a result, children's individual needs are quickly identified and exceptionally well met."

Ofsted felt that "The management team set high expectations for the quality of the provision, practitioners' performance and children's achievements," and, in delivering the inspection outcome, the inspector stated that she had never seen so many examples of outstanding practice in one setting in one inspection. Elmscot feel that this is the exceptional service that any parent would hope for and that all their registered families deserve.



At Hale, the Squirrel and Otter rooms have recently had a make over. The rooms have both been decorated and have had new flooring put down and additional displays boards have been put up around the room to display more of the children's work. The team have also developed a Construction area for the children in the Squirrel room following the children's current interests.

Work is due to start on the car park at Hale to resurface the whole area and improve access to the nursery. E bulletins will be sent to parents prior to the work starting to keep everyone updated of progress.

At Woodlands, we have been working very hard to get our garden prepared for the spring. We have revamped our Outdoor Classrooms under the awning – including our Book Area and Mark Marking Area. With the weather getting better now we are looking forward to using our Woodwork area and Writing Shed to its full potential again. Furthermore, we have had brand new trellises put up in our Allotment area where the children will plant peas and beans, as well as other vegetables and herbs in our planting tubs. In our rooms, the team have been working on introducing lots of new initiatives for the children to take part in such as Star of the Week, Interests boards, Parent information boards, Treasure boxes and loads more.

At Elmscot we have developed a meeting room in the basement, which provides us with an additional welcoming space for any meetings with our parents and visitors.

We are also in a process of developing some new activity boxes for the garden area, to further extend children's learning opportunities while they are outdoors.

Elmscot Day Nursery has decided to take part in the I CAN Early Talk programme which supports the early years practitioners in developing their skills in the vital area of children's communication and language through training packages, mentoring and service development, which includes accreditation.

I CAN is the children's communication charity which want to ensure that no child is left behind because of their difficulty in speaking or understanding language. Their mission is to raise an awareness of the importance of communication in children's lives and to upskill the early years practitioners in meeting all children's needs in communication and language development.

Children with communication difficulties may, in the future, find it hard to read, write and make friends. This is why supporting every child in their communication and language development is a crucial part of our daily activities and learning opportunities we offer to all children.

I CAN Early Talk accreditation recognises good practice in promoting speech, language and communication development in line with expectations for children's age. It also recognises good practice in the early identification and referral of children to Speech and Language therapy.

Elmscot will pilot the scheme prior to it being rolled out across all nursery setting.
