

Tax Free Childcare 30 Hour Funding

The government is introducing new ways to help parents with childcare costs. Parents with the youngest children first are being invited to apply for tax free childcare and 30 hour funding via: www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

Tax Free Childcare

This is a new way of making savings on and paying for your childcare – all Elmscot settings are registered to accept payments via this method.

For every £8 you pay into your online account, the government will add in an extra £2, up to £2000 per child per year (£4000 for disabled children).

However, you can't use tax free childcare at the same time as Childcare Vouchers, Universal Credit, or tax credits. There are online calculators to help you decide which scheme would be best for your family.







But, you **can** use it in conjunction with 15 or 30hour funding to maximise savings.

30 hour funding

As you will be aware, the government have introduced a new scheme through which working families may be entitled to 30hours of funding for 3-4 year olds, rather than the 15hours currently offered.

Here's the small print! These schemes are for working families, including the self-employed, in the UK with children under 12 (or under 17 if disabled). All Elmscot staff are committed to attending the most current training available and regularly participate in refresher training. This ensures our nursery practitioners are highly skilled and allows us to provide outstanding childcare and education.



Teachers at Elmscot



Although not an Ofsted requirement, Elmscot Group employ qualified graduate teachers who work with the pre-school teams to support children's learning across the Early Years Foundation Stage and prepare them for Reception. Our teachers are extra to the statutory adult:child ratio of 1:8 (1:16 in a school nursery), which allows them to give more individual attention to each child.

The teachers work closely with practitioners to assess children's learning and understand their interests; then using the EYFS structure deliver rich and balanced learning activities best suited to each child. They follow children's individual needs in order to provide a stimulating and challenging environment for them, with a strong focus on developing children's independence, confidence and social skills, necessary for the school environment.

Our teachers start the day's routine with a short circle time session, focussing on Phase 1 Phonics, Communication and Language. Using a play-based approach to learning, teachers encourage children to develop their skills and enhance their understanding as they spend time with each child, tailoring an activity to each child. At the end of the day, the teachers celebrate the children's achievements and share work such as story scribing and junk modelling. Teachers and practitioners assess the children's progress on a weekly basis to enable further planning.

The teacher's role is crucial in getting the children 'school ready', and the best transition includes families and schools. Elmscot's planned transition process, regularly praised by local schools, aims to

Nursery Development

Congratulations to Broussa on achieving the Trafford 'Healthy Setting Award' in Spring which celebrates the setting's approach to supporting children and families in leading healthy lifestyles. The nursery has also seen development of the outdoor learning environment with the addition of our new chickens and guinea pigs, which are very much loved by the children. Our sand and water resources, the woodwork activities and large tent in the outdoor nature area have also been developed. New resources for our Squirrels room were purchased including new role play materials, dressing up tabards, musical instruments, new sand and water resources including a new display unit to make it easier for children to select resources to enhance their play. The children are also enjoying the large cosy cushions in the book area to make it more inviting.
