Elmscot Group Nursery Developments

Each year, all Elmscot Group Nurseries produce a Development Plan of what their setting would like to invest in over the coming year. Here are just some of the projects we have completed within the last 12 months.

As the ages within the rooms have shifted at Elmscot Altrincham, the team has been concentrating on making sure the resources within each room are age appropriate. The practitioners observed the babies and toddlers to look at their interests and how money can be invested into these areas.

In Willow Room at Elmscot Altrincham, children were

starting younger than previously, so the team looked at areas and ideas they had learned from training. This led them to develop the black and white area and make calming, sensory bottles.

To further develop the setting for younger babies, Elmscot Altrincham purchased a soft outdoor surface to make the playground more accessible. This is now a designated baby area and more resources were bought to suit the individual development and ages of the children.

The allotment areas were also developed at Elmscot Altrincham to give the children more involvement in gardening experiences. Two of the allotment boxes were removed and replaced with higher planters and two further boxes are now being used to plant vegetables.

Elmscot Broussa has made many impressive and progressive changes to the nursery environment to benefit both the children and families. The setting has invested in



a new garden, which ensures the children have opportunity to develop their physical skills, build stronger muscles and improve bone density. The children have really enjoyed the large surface to ride their bikes, whilst enjoying the natural environment.

Investments have also been made into communication-friendly spaces within each room at Elmscot Broussa. This is because children need to acquire sound and listening skills in order to communicate effectively. These spaces absorb sound and therefore children can access some vital quiet time during the busy day.

Play is essential to development, as it contributes to the cognitive, physical, social and emotional wellbeing of children. The Elmscot Broussa team has therefore spent a lot of time listening to and observing the children's interests. This has enabled the team to buy resources that follow their interests and continue enabling the children's learning and development.

A lot of decorating has taken place at Elmscot Hale over recent months. This has mainly been in Badger Room, where the environment now looks brighter and fresher for the children to enjoy. More decorating is being planned and the team is looking forward to seeing the plans come together.
