TEACHERS' NEWSLETTER

This half term we are planning lots of activities to support the children who will be starting Reception in September. All settings organised 'transition to school' meetings earlier this term to share some information of how we aim to prepare each child for school so they are confident, independent and enthusiastic to learn.

We have started reading lots of stories about starting school and providing the children with opportunities to talk about their thoughts and feelings. We have added some school-themed enhancements to role-play area, such as school uniforms. We hold school uniform days so children can talk about their new clothes and have P.E days so children can practice their skills in dressing and undressing on their own.

Children have been introduced to school-style lunch to support them in becoming more independent at mealtime. The children are encouraged to serve themselves and walk to their table to eat with their peers. After lunch they are encouraged to return and stack their trays/ plates, cutlery and glass, which is a system they use in schools. We will be contacting Reception class teachers at the schools to pass on information and help build a clear picture of each child, ensuring a smoother transition for all involved.

Outdoor learning

As the weather turns warmer we are enjoying learning outside. Many of our indoor activities are extended outside so children can benefit from the outdoor environment.

The children will begin to explore the season of Summer and the changes that happen in the garden. A key focus will be the changes in plants, trees and mini-beasts. We will also be exploring changes to our bodies in hot weather and how to take care of ourselves. To develop PSED skills we will be encouraging children to create their own games, work as a team to problem solve and take part in mini P.E sessions.

Termly Themes

As the weather warms up we will be creating more mathematical opportunities for them in our outdoor areas.

Phonics and Literacy

We are continuing to teach phonics using the Phase 1 Letters and Sounds Government resource. All seven aspects have been covered over the Preschool year and we are now consolidating the children's learning and sharpening those speaking and listening skills ready for Phase two phonics in Reception class.

Our choice of books continue to reflect on children's interests and special themes such as Father's Day, Summer time and of course transitioning to school. All texts are selected carefully to ensure children can explore new story language, retell stories and understand story structures. Many of our room based activities stem from our focus stories allowing children to consolidate and extend their learning.
